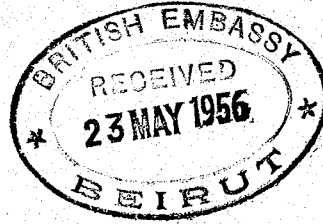

Dear Ian,

With reference to our meeting, and to the authority given to me to conclude the purchase of the school property, I met Judge Tali and transmitted to him the approved letter in Arabic. He signified his agreement by signing two copies of this letter, of which I enclose one for your files.

With regard to the group of houses, Judge Tali and myself will start negotiations with the owners next week. Consequently for the time being it would be advisable not to publish the fact that a sale of the property has been concluded.

I advised Judge Tali that a cheque in the amount of LL. 48,500 would be transmitted to him on Tuesday. In view of the fact that I am exercising the option on your behalf, it would be advisable to make out the cheque to my order, and I will endorse it to Judge Tali.

I omitted to mention that the broker's fees are also due. The amount at the rate of 2.5% which is what Judge Tali is also paying comes to LL. 12.175. Would you please send me a cheque in that amount any time it is convenient for you to do so.

I wish to add that should Hamid Bey Franjeh require any assistance from me I shall be happy to give it.

In the meantime I shall keep you advised of developments in regard to the group of houses.
