I am honored and proud to share that I am prominently featured in the prestigious encyclopedia "Pioneers From Lebanon – Pionniers du Liban – رواد من لبنان" among a highly distinguished list of great Lebanese Pioneers such as Fairuz and Oscar-winner composer Gabriel Yared. The encyclopedia is endorsed by the Lebanese Ministry of Culture and sponsored by the UNESCO Cultural Heritage and Treasure Museum of Sila. It features an extensive biography of my pioneering musical career as the first female rock star of the Middle East, with insights, an in-depth interview, as well as a portrait drawing of me done by Lebanese-Italian artist Ziad Fatouh.
